
ACTIVITY

The downward trend in the market experienced in 2004 continued in 2005. Gold throughput decreased by 20%, silver by 16%, and platinum by 7%. Overall the level of activity has returned to that of 1997. Imports exceeded domestic products in both gold and silver, although this is not the case in platinum despite imports increasing by 65%. Usually temporary staff are employed during the last four months of the year to deal with the pre-Christmas demand, but the decline in activity in 2005 did not warrant additional staff.

ANTIQUE PLATE COMMITTEE

In total, 98 pieces were examined, of which 39 conformed to the Hallmarking Act. The remainder comprised 16 pieces with alterations and additions, 5 with transposed marks and 38 with counterfeit marks. A total of 25 pieces are now held pending investigation by the Metropolitan Police. The 'black museum of fakes' is no longer black. All 601 pieces have been cleaned, photographed and catalogued, and the intention now is to dispose of those pieces which are not of particular interest.

SUSPECTED OFFENCES

There were 16 suspected offences against the Hallmarking Act reported to the Office by Local Authority Trading Standards Officers, with no resulting prosecutions. A team of Trading Standards Officers from Newham visited the Office. A joint project with seven London boroughs is at the final planning stage.

STANDARDS COMMITTEES

There have been no meetings of the International Standards Committee TC 174 or the European Standards Committee TC 283. Nevertheless the European Standards on nickel testing have been amended, the new standard being BS EN 12472.2005. A set of guidelines has been issued on the whiteness of white gold. It is an adaptation of the colour indices used for plastics. The Assay Office now has a spectrometer which can test the whiteness according to the guidelines.

INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION

Hungary, Israel, Poland, and Ukraine have all ratified accession to the Convention. An inspection of the assay offices in Slovakia was completed successfully, and therefore Slovakia has been invited to accede. Five countries have yet to ratify amendments to the Articles and Annexes of the Convention. The amendments provide the Standing Committee with a less bureaucratic

method of amending the technical aspects of the Convention. The Secretariat has moved to new offices in Geneva. Slovenia has indicated that it is preparing to accede. France, Spain and Estonia are the remaining EU hallmarking countries yet to accede. Further afield, representatives from Bahrain, China, Dubai, India, Malaya, Sri Lanka and Uzbekistan have been attending the Standing Committee.

ASSOCIATION OF EUROPEAN ASSAY OFFICES

In the UK, enforcement of the Act usually consists of a visit to retailers by Trading Standards Officers. In voluntary hallmarking countries, visits are also made to manufacturers. Mrs P Ruotsalainen of Finland conducted a survey of the market surveillance system operating in the EU hallmarking countries. The annual fee payable has built up a fund sufficient to finance a number of round robins each year. This is a vital part of retaining accreditation of laboratories to ISO 17025, the results being tabulated and collated by Ms Isabel Morais of Portugal.
